PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Visits to archaeological sites and sanctuaries including the Akropolis, Parthenon, Temple of Zeus, and the ancient Agora (marketplace)
- Excursions outside Athens to Delphi, Sounion, Eleusis, and the island of Aegina
- Experiencing Greece like ancient peoples by following in the footsteps of ancient authors such as Pausanias, author of *Guide to Greece*

Academic Focus

Greece is a land where ancient myths come to life. This program offers students an intensive, hand-on study of the art, architecture and culture of ancient Greece. By visiting the key historical and architectural sites of Athens, Attica, and Delphi students will gain a feel for the experiential dimensions of ancient monuments and their role in the story of its people. The setting is a prime location to explore Mediterranean architecture, archaeology and topography. Greek art and architecture is foundational in the history of western art and civilization, and this program is a wonderful complement to other courses students might take within the Department of Art or the Culture and Historic Preservation program as well as for students with a general interest in the field who wish to fulfill their core complement abroad.

Course Expectations

Students must attend pre-departure orientations and meetings. All readings must be done prior to visiting each site on the itinerary. Final grades will depend on on-site presentations, journal entries, quizzes, a group project, a final paper, and participation.

Accommodations

Lodging: Students will be housed in simply furnished apartments in the Pangrati neighborhood of central Athens. Apartments vary based on availability. 3-6 students will share apartments and may share double-occupancy rooms.

Meals: 2-3 group meals are included in the program fee as well as lunch on most days. Students should expect to pay for breakfast and dinner on most days. Apartments will have basic kitchens where students can prepare their own meals.



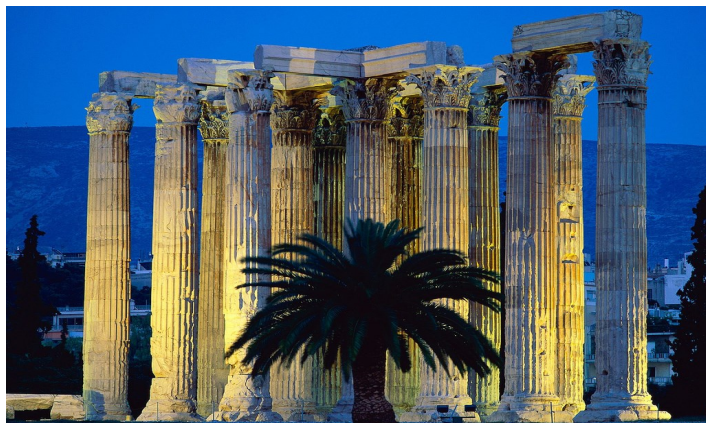
Eligibility Requirements
