Registration Guidelines for First-Year History and Secondary Education/History Majors Fall 2018

Full-time undergraduate students register for 12 to 17 credits per semester to earn 120 credits in eight semesters. First-year students in the History major are advised to register for the following:

- UNV101, University Seminar I (3 credits) and FYT100, First Year Seminar (1 credit) (You will be automatically registered for FYT-100 because it is linked to your UNV-101 choice)
- **HIS113,** US History to 1877 (3 credits)
