### Types of Service

- Service to:
  - Department
  - University
  - Community
  - Profession/Field

### Types of Service: Department

#### Examples to include on your CV:

- Departmental Committees
- Departmental Search Committees
- Social Media Coordinator for Department
- Honor Society Advisor
- Advisor to Clubs

- Organizing Special Departmental Events (e.g., Organizing a Career Night for your majors)
- Designing Departmental Materials (e.g., brochures)
- Ways in which you go above and beyond for your department

#### **Examples for your Narrative only:**

- Attendance at Open Houses/Connections Day
- Efforts to Recruit Students
- Ways in which you are a good departmental citizen working to make your department better

### Types of Service: University

#### **Examples to include on your CV:**

- Elected Committees
- Appointed Committees
- Task Forces
- Ad hoc Committees
- Participation in NEASC review/self-study
- University-Level Search Committees
- Collegium
- Pell Center Roundtables
- Participating in University Discussion Groups (e.g., Sister Leona's CIT group)

- Organizing University-Wide Lectures
- Sports Team Mentor
- Study Abroad/Away Participation (non-teaching components)
- White papers
- Ways in which you go above and beyond for your department
- Activities that increase Salve's reputation to outside bodies

#### **Examples for your Narrative only:**

- Attendance at Faculty Assembly Meetings
- Going to Graduation/Convocation
- Driving Establishment of Connections with Outside Entities (e.g., Internships, Articulation Agreements)
- Ways in which you are a visible, active faculty member

### Types of Service: Community

#### **Examples to include on your CV:**

- Serving on boards and committees
  - Board member Social Work Licensing, State of Rhode Island Department of Health, Appointed by Governor
- Lectures and discussions at local churches, schools, libraries, galleries
- Judging science, robotic, cultural fairs
- Trainings
  - Trainor for State of Rhode Island Department of Training
- Mentoring
- Engagement with community partners
  - Fundraisers such as Alzheimer's Walk, Relay for Life
- Responses to need in the event of an community emergency
- Volunteer work that connects to the University mission
- Testifying at the statehouse

### Types of Service: Field/Profession

#### Different Levels:

- State
  National
- Regional
  International

#### Examples to include on your CV:

- Holding a Leadership Position in a Professional Association
- Chairing a Committee for a Professional Organization
- Local, Regional, National Trainings
- Running a Conference
- Organizing a Panel
- Active Membership in a Professional Association

#### **Examples for your Narrative only:**

Membership in Organizations Relevant to Your Field

### Where To Go from Here

- Collect evidence/artifacts of service, e.g.:
  - Letters from Committee Chairs or Committee Members that highlight what you brought to a committee
  - Copies of pages from Faculty Achievements book (Graduation luncheon)
  - Flyers/Brochures for events/department
  - Copy of a Website displaying your role in an organization
- Organize your evidence/artifacts of service:
  - Service Binder with Table of Contents
- Focus on aspects of service that are special to you
- Include discussion of how you fulfill job requirements in your narrative
