	Complete the "Do What You Are" online assessment tool accessible at: http://www.salve.edu/career-development/students		Attend the Major and Minor Fair during the fall semester and speak with faculty and students from various departments.
	Work with a career counselor in the Office of Career Development to use the "Do What You Are" resource to better understand your personality style and strengths in relation to exploring majors and careers.		Schedule an appointment with your Discovery Advisor. Discovery Advisors are faculty members trained to work specifically with students who are still researching majors and minors. They are very helpful!
	Write a paragraph about why you decided to go to college. This is a reflection paper for you and does not need to entail formal grammar or style. Let the writing flow. Save the reflection as a Microsoft Word document for future use between you and the staff in the Center for Student Development, Career Development, and/or your Discovery Advisor. 			Talk with your peers or student mentors. Peers are great resources for learning more about majors and minors.
			Request informational interviews from individuals in careers that may be of interest to you. Find out what they pursued academically and professionally.
