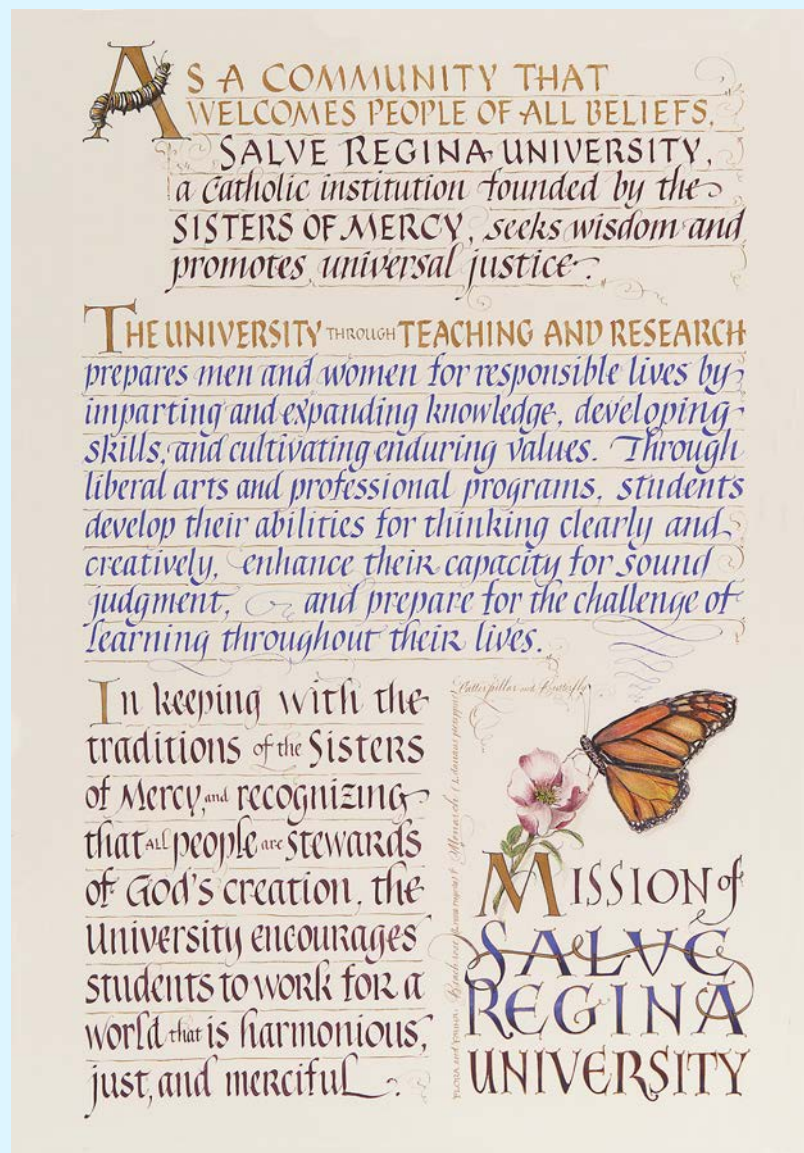

Download the App

Search for Corq on the App Store or Play Store and download!

Search "Salve Regina"

Select Salve Regina University as your campus and it will direct you to all our campus events.

Log In

On the top left corner, sign in with your Salve credentials (salve email without "@salve.edu"). You can then see all the events you have chosen to attend.

Download your Event Pass

On the top left corner, click "Event Pass." Add it to your wallet to make future event check-in's easy!

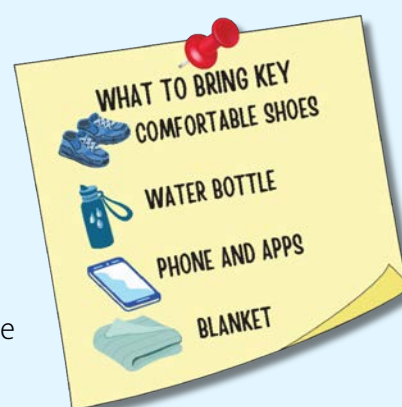
