MSC 399 Special Topics: Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven - In the Footsteps of the Masters (3 credits)

Course fulfills:

- Visual and Performing Arts Requirement (Part III.B.), Western Experience Theme, elective in Music major or minor, a free elective for all other majors
- Program is also open to students not seeking academic credit

Program Highlights

- Visit Mozart's birth city of Salzburg and see where he wrote and performed his first symphonies.
- Revel in a performance at the Vienna State Opera
- See the baroque monastery and Bruckner Organ in St. Florian
- Learn about Mozart's time in Vienna, his adopted city, at the Figaro House
- Learn more about Haydn life as music director for the Esterházy family in Eisenstadt
- Tour the magnificent gardens at Schönbrunn Palace





Academic Focus

Austria is the place that has been noted for the significant contributions of its resident composers to its legacy of classical music. In this class, delivered during the spring semester, readings, listening assignments and DVD viewings will support students in understanding the music of composing giants Haydn, Mozart and Beethoven. Then, by taking a journey to Austria to follow their footsteps, students will immerse themselves in the cultural and historical context of these composers, touring the churches and public buildings they visited, the houses in which they lodged, and the palaces, concert halls and salons in which they performed. Participants will take in the sights and sounds of Salzburg and Vienna, the leading intellectual and artistic crossroads of Europe in the 18th and 19th centuries, and will experience first-hand the artistic lure that inspired some of the world's greatest and most enduring music.

Course Expectations

Students taking part in the program for academic credit will enroll in MSC 399 Special Topics during spring term registration. Students will attend course sessions as scheduled prior to and after the program. Course requirements will be outlined on the course syllabus. Students not enrolling in the course will be expected to attend two pre-departure sessions related to the program content and to complete selected reading and listening assignments pre-departure. While in Austria all students will visit sites related to the assigned readings and keep a daily reflective journal. In addition, all students are required to participate in mandatory study abroad pre-departure orientations (dates TBA). Please note that participation in the program will require students to miss other academic classes held on Thursday March 10. However, this does not constitute an excused absence. All students must communicate at the start of the term with their faculty and develop an approved plan for missed work and/or exams.

Accommodations/Meals

Lodging: Students will share a double or triple occupancy room at tourist class hotels with other Salve Regina students.
Meals: The program fee includes breakfast at the hotel and 2 group meals while in Austria. Students will be on their own for lunch and dinner on most days.

Eligibility Requirements

- Open to all students
- Minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA
- Availability of academic credits to fulfill degree requirements
- Good disciplinary, financial and academic standing at the time of program departure.
- Participation in mandatory pre-departure orientation sessions, dates TBD.

Flight

Participants will be booked onto the group flight unless they notify the CGEF in writing that they will make their own arrangements. To do so, email studyabroad@salve.edu by December 1, 2023. A refund for the flight (amount TBD) will be issued. The CGEF is unable to book seats for participants on flights other than the round-trip group flight. Participants making their own flight arrangements will need to meet the group at the designated time and airport location so that they can join the group shuttle. No flights should be booked until programs are confirmed and meeting times and locations are officially communicated to participants.

Course credits are paid as part of spring undergraduate tuition .
Credits in excess of a 17 full time credit load will be charged at the per credit rate.

Payment Schedule

\$1200 Deposit due by December 20, 2023 Your deposit holds your space in the program. Please be aware that there is a withdrawal and refund policy outlined in your Participation Agreement. **Final Payment** is due by February 1, 2024. The Business Office will generate an invoice for the remainder of the program fee in January.
