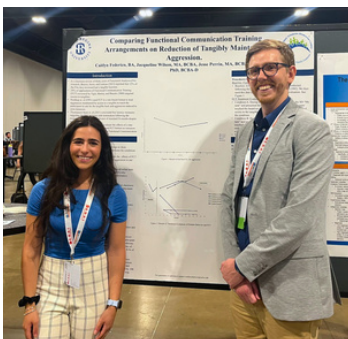
LEADING FACULTY
