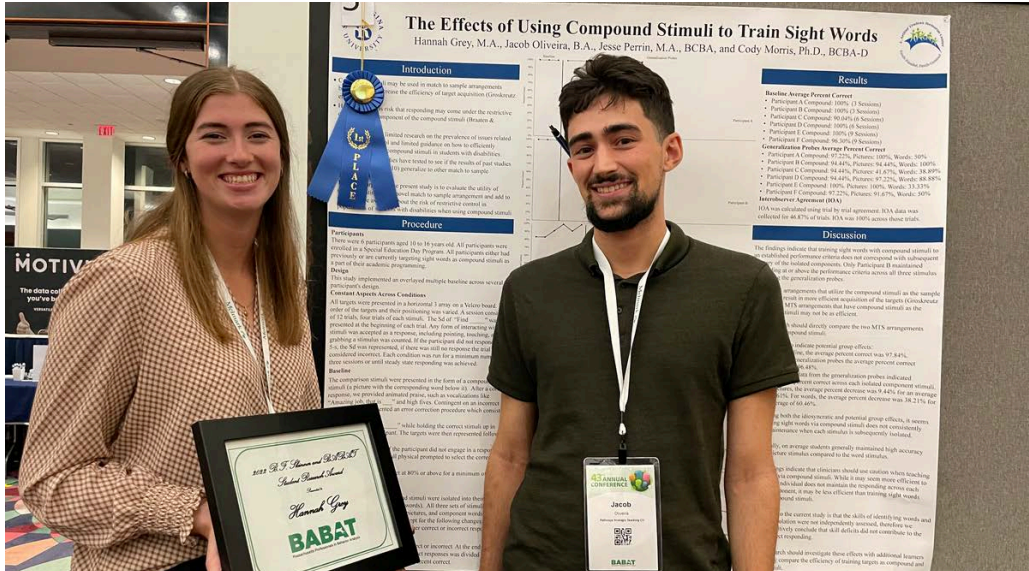

- Demonstrate the ability to teach and translate behavior-analytic material to diverse audiences
- Demonstrate the ability to supervise behavior-analytic research and clinical services in diverse settings
