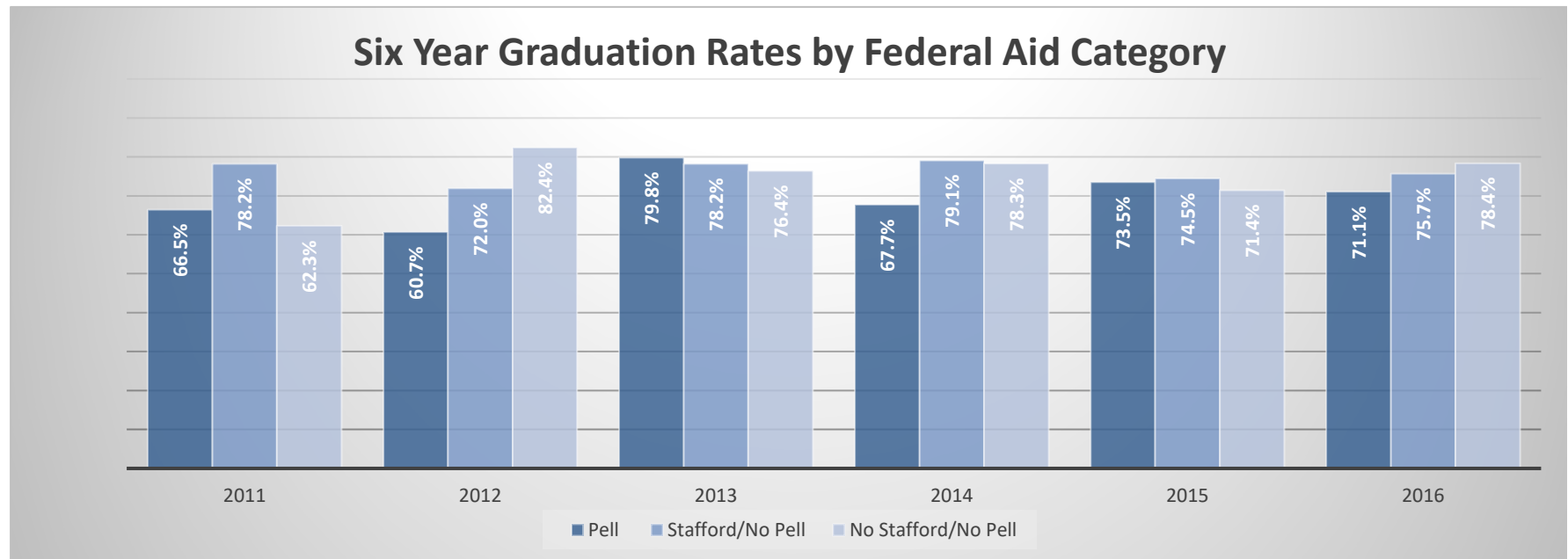

Six Year Graduation Rates Disaggregated by Financial Aid Category for Full-Time, First-Time Students by Entering Cohort Bachelors or equivalent degree-seeking cohort

Students who received a Pell Grant	66.5%	60.7%	79.8%	67.7%	73.5%	71.1%
Students who did not receive a Pell Grant	72.8%	76.0%	77.5%	78.7%	73.1%	76.7%
Recipients of a Subsidized Stafford Loan/No Pell Grant	78.2%	72.0%	78.2%	79.1%	74.5%	75.7%
Recipients of neither a Subsidized Stafford Loan nor Pell Grant	62.3%	82.4%	76.4%	78.3%	71.4%	78.4%
Overall 6 Year Graduation Rate	70.9%	72.1%	77.9%	75.9%	73.2%	75.5%



Notes: For the purposes of the IPEDS Graduation Rate reporting, a recipient of a Pell Grant or Subsidized Direct Loan is a student who receives and uses that award (i.e., award is partially or fully disbursed) within their first year at the institution (July 1 - June 30). In accordance with The Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990 and the Higher Education Act, the above graduation/completion rates reflect the percent of students who, from the time of their initial enrollment as full-time students during the fall semester indicated, completed their program of studies and graduated within 150% of the “normal time” allotted. 150% of a program normally taking four years is six years. Disclosure of graduation rates disaggregated by aid category is required by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008.
