During this 4-week program, students will join Education professor Dr. Tracy Pelkowski in Reggio Emilia, Italy. Hosted by University Studies Abroad Consortium (USAC), all students will take "Child and Adolescent Development and the Theories of Learning" with Dr. Pelkowski, and then select a second 3-credit course from USAC's offerings. This program offers a unique opportunity for education or psychology students to fulfill major or minor requirements and/or core requirements. Program highlights include a visit to a cheese factory and balsamic vinegar production cellar, field trips to Bologna and Rimini, and the opportunity to experience Italian culture, drink a real cappuccino, eat gelato, and live la dolce vita!

Academics

- 1. All students enroll in 3-credit EDC/ELC/SCD-220 "Child and Adolescent Development and the Theories of Learning" with Dr. Pelkowski.
 - Course fulfills Education major/minor requirement or can substitute PSY-220 for Psychology majors.
- 2. Students choose a second course from the following USAC Reggio Emilia local offerings:
 - Intercultural Communication (300 level, 3 credits)
 - Fulfills Social Sciences core requirement or Group 5 Psychology major elective.
 - Italian/International Educational Approaches: Reggio and Montessori (400 level, 3 credits)
 - Fulfills Social Sciences core requirement

Eligibility Requirements

- Open to first year and sophomore education students.
- Good disciplinary, financial and academic standing at the time of program departure.
- 2.7 or higher GPA

Academic Focus

Reggio Emilia, Italy is famous for its approach to early childhood education, where healthy child development is viewed as the collective responsibility of the local community. In this education course, students will immerse themselves in the cultural context of Italian childhood, participating in a highly interactive format involving presentations, readings, guest speakers, and tours. Students will learn from Italian professionals in the family services and educational fields who work directly with children. They will take a field trip to the Centro Internazionale Loris Malaguzzi to learn about the values, history, and organization of Reggio Emilia's approach to early childhood education. Students will observe children at play at a local infant and toddler center. They will explore the intersection of sustainability, creativity, and research at the REMIDA Center, which works to promote the protection of children's rights. Students will journey to the nearby city of Parma to tour Il Tappo di Sughero, a play experience space designed for welcoming children and families who need extra sensory motor and relational development support.

Course Expectations

A mandatory pre-departure meeting will be held in the spring to inform students of program content and requirements. Expect a rewarding curriculum that includes classroom lectures and local excursions. You'll be expected to actively participate in all activities, complete assignments on time, and engage respectfully with diverse cultures.

- Participation in mandatory pre-departure orientation
