Winter Ecology- Life in the Snow

White Mountains, New Hampshire

Program Highlights

This program, offered in cooperation with the Appalachian Mountain Club, will bring students into the White Mountains to learn about winter ecology and to experience backcountry winter hiking firsthand. The 7 day program will begin at the AMC facilities at Pinkham Notch where students will stay overnight and be oriented to concepts of winter ecology, fitted with equipment (e.g. backpacks, snowshoes, micro spikes, camp stoves etc.) and introduced to winter hiking techniques and considerations. The group will then head out for a multi-day hike to an AMC hut or tent site. Students will read material about adaptations to winter and the mountains and then explore those conditions and environments, in depth, for a week in the White Mountains in the middle of winter. Participants should be prepared for a variety of outdoor conditions and be willing to take part in a range of strenuous outdoor activities.
