How did we get here?

- Series of conversations with community members in Summer and Fall 2021
- Participants included Superintendent of Schools, Executive Director of Newport Community Schools and other educational agencies
- African-American and Latino leaders of the Newport Community.

Target Population:

- Future first-generation college students.
 The HORIZON SCHOLARS
- Students whose living environments foster an opportunity gap.

3-year Program:

- Year 1/Cohort 1: Start with 10th graders –follow them and families for three years
- Year 2/ Cohorts 1 & 2: Recruit new 10th graders.
 Continue with 11th graders
- Year 3/Cohort 1, 2 and 3: Final year for Cohort 1.
 Continue with cohorts 2 & 3.





Short-term goals: What's Next

- Assessing after year 1
- Developing year 2 programming
- Recruiting new grade 9 students
- Additional funding
- sponsorship for travel expenses for students
- stipends for summer camps (students and salve mentors)

Long-term Vision:

- Endowed position
- Apply to become an Upward Bound Institution
 -Federal funding
- Offer dual-enrollment Rogers/Salve.
- Offer preferential admission to nursing/education students from Rogers

Activities

- Two days a week with Salve Regina
- On-campus academic and enrichment activities
 - Visits to Salve Regina's Newport partners
 - Workshops for guardians4-times a year
 - SAT/ACT Prep
 - Mock Classes
 - Field trips
 - college visits
 - Salve Summer Camp

Outputs

- 100% of students will attend events at Salve Regina
- 100% of seniors apply to college and other post-secondary opportunities
- 100% of students will have resources to reach their potential
 - 100% of students will receive tutoring
 - 4 college visits including one out of state
- 60 hours of weekday programming
- 10 hours of optional weekend programming
- 8 hours of parent/ guardian programming

Impact

- Children mature with the skills and resources necessary to be healthy, contributing, & self-sufficient adults.
- Create action items to develop talents & dreams
- Improve decision making skills
 - Reduce risky behaviors
 - Build positive relationships
- Build leadership skills
- Increase sense of belonging

Outcomes

- Progress to next grade level
- Less absenteeism
 - Better grades
- Better retention

- Graduation from high school
- Understanding of pathway to college and careers
- Parent-as-teachers to the rest of the community
- Enrollment in college/community college/trade school, etc.
