During this 4-week program, students will join the Summer Session I program at the American University of Rome (AUR) in Rome, Italy. Led by Dr. Condella from Salve Regina's Philosophy department, all students will be required to take the "Philosophy of Science" course and then choose a second course from the AUR Summer Session portfolio of courses. This program offers a unique opportunity to fulfill a variety of core and/or major requirements. The experience includes a weekend trip to the Tuscan cities of Florence, Siena, Trequanda, and Montecatini where students will visit cathedrals, palaces, city squares, all amid beautiful landscapes.

Academics

- 1. All students enroll in 3-credit "Philosophy of Science" course taught by Dr. Condella
 - Fulfills Philosophy core requirement, or major/minor requirement in Philosophy
- 2. Students will select a second 3-credit course from the American University of Rome Summer Session I portfolio
 - Select from courses in Religion, Literature, History, Art, Tourism, Archaeology, Business,
 Communications, Environment, Fashion, Italian, Journalism, Law, Photography, and more!
 - Work with CGEF and Department Chair for approval toward major/minor or core requirements
 - All course fulfillments are subject to approval by an advisor.

Eligibility Requirements

- Open to first year through senior year students. Particularly useful for students needing the philosophy core requirement or those interested in the history of scientific thought.
- Good disciplinary, financial and academic standing at the time of program departure.
- 2.7 or higher GPA

How to Apply

Complete an online application and submit all required materials on the <u>ViaTRM</u> portal by the program deadline.

Materials include:

- · 250 word essay on your study abroad goals
- Faculty reference
- Photo of passport or self-disclosure of passport application
- Headshot

Academic Focus

Students will delve into key themes in the Philosophy of Science, with a special focus on the Copernican Revolution and the pivotal contributions of Italian thinkers such as Campanella, Bruno, and, most notably, Galileo. Rome served as the epicenter of the intense clash of worldviews, culminating in Galileo's trial and eventual house arrest. Exploring locations throughout the city, including the Vatican, and the Galileo Museum in Florence, will provide students with a rich historical context, bringing to life the dramatic events of the early 17th century that shaped modern scientific thought.

Course Expectations

A mandatory pre-departure meeting will be held in the spring to inform students of program content and requirements. Expect a rewarding curriculum that includes classroom lectures and local excursions. You'll be expected to actively participate in all activities, complete assignments on time, and engage respectfully with diverse cultures.

- Open to all students (first year through senior)
- Min GPA 2.7
- Availability of academic credits to fulfill degree requirements
- · Good disciplinary, financial and academic standing
- Participation in mandatory pre-departure orientation
