The Certificate of Advanced Graduate Studies (CAGS) in Clinical Mental Health: Concentration in Holistic Counseling is a post-master's certificate that provides additional courses and clinical experience. Thus, counselors have the academic credits needed to sign up for the Mental Health Counseling Licensure exam in Rhode Island and other states. The courses provide counselors with a holistic and systemic approach to frame their future mental health work. The program seeks to help students learn and understand how to observe, assess, and incorporate the integration of body, mind, and spirit into their professional and personal lives. We integrate elements of the Five Critical Concerns for Mercy into our training, including racism, issues impacting women, immigration, the earth, and violence. Students learn to see clients in a multifaceted, holistic way through understanding various systemic and cultural experiences.

To earn this certificate, students complete courses in holistic counseling that match licensure needs and their academic history, along with up to 700 hours of clinical counseling work in the field. Some students will need more than 12-credits to complete their certificate to meet state-specific academic requirements for licensure as a mental health counselor. It is recommended that students explore licensure requirements as a mental health counselors in the state where they intend to practice. Upon acceptance, individual degree plans are created based on students' past coursework and academic needs. Following successful completion of the program, the Rhode Island Board of Mental Health Counselors and Marriage and Family Therapists requires a candidate to complete two years (2,000 hours) of relevant mental health counseling experience in the workplace with 100 hours of clinical supervision from a board-approved supervisor prior to taking the LMHC Examination.

The Certificate of Advanced Graduate Studies (CAGS) is designed for those students who have completed a master's degree from an accredited institution and who are seeking advanced knowledge within their field of study. Students must consult with the graduate program director before pursuing this certificate regarding the appropriate program for their career interests.

To apply to this program, students must submit the following supporting materials to the Office of Graduate Admissions:

- Completed application
- Official transcripts from each college or university attended
- Two professional letters of recommendation
- Personal statement
- Resume
