## Discover Your Voice with the Newport MFA

Salve Regina University's Master of Fine Arts in creative writing program – the Newport MFA – immerses students in the creative life through residencies and mentorships, publishing and editing panels and craft talks, always with a sustained focus on writing. Our two-year creative writing program provides dedicated faculty mentorship in the genres of fiction, poetry, nonfiction and historical fiction and culminates with each student completing a polished manuscript.

The low-residency format of our MFA in creative writing program honors the increasing demands on students' time, teaching them to integrate writing into their day and setting them on the path to becoming lifelong writers. And through our popular accelerated program, qualified Salve Regina undergraduates can begin the Newport MFA during their senior (fourth) year.

## Designed to Transform Your Writing and Expand Your Career

- Complete four residency/mentorship semesters in chosen genre(s), followed by a final graduation residency
- Each residency is focused on writing, daily workshops, craft lectures, manuscript consultations and keynote readings
- Dedicated time for focused, immersive graduate study
- Strong emphasis on professional writing aspects, including contact with literary agents, editors and publishers

Following the writing residency, students return home to a focused course of study under the attentive supervision of a faculty mentor. During the final residency, students complete a polished manuscript and give a public reading of their creative work.
