Polling was conducted online from June 16-22, 2025. Using Dynamic Online Sampling to attain a representative sample, Embold Research polled 804 general election 2024 voters in Rhode Island. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, region, and 2024 presidential vote.
