Percentage in Graduate School	INDICATOR: Self-reported graduate school acceptance and attendance at six months after earning bachelor's degree. Includes students that earned their degree in the prior academic year. CALCULATION: Number of students in graduate school is divided by the total number of students for which information was gathered. <i>NOTE: Information was gathered by email surveys, Salve Regina University registration data, and public profile information. The Business and Economics Department at Salve Regina University provided the report data.</i>

Graduation Rate	<p>INDICATOR: The 3-year graduation rate represents the percentage of cohort members that completed a master's degree in a business program within 3 years from the time that they officially entered the program.</p> <p>CALCULATION: The 3-year graduation rate is the ratio of students that began the given program between July 1 and June 30 period and the number that completed master's degree requirements within three years of study (based on the student's start date in the program compared to the student's degree date).</p> <p><i>NOTE: The calculations presented for graduation rate were determined by the Salve Regina University Office of Institutional Research and Effectiveness.</i></p>
