Salve’s 12-credit, four-course Certificate of Graduate Studies (CGS) programs are designed for students looking for continued professional development without the formal pursuit of a master’s degree, as well as to enhance their master’s degree with a skill-based certificate. Our certificate programs in administration of justice – **cybersecurity and intelligence, digital forensics and leadership in justice** – offer students the opportunity to broaden their professional careers with topics that are crucial in today’s environment.

Our Programs

As the need for cybersecurity specialists continues to escalate, our **cybersecurity and intelligence** certificate trains managers to lead in this rapidly-changing environment and bridge the communication gap between management and technicians.

Our **digital forensics** certificate introduces students to the fundamental principles and techniques of computer network architecture, proper evidence storage collection, and federal rules and criminal codes. Graduates understand how foreign, state-sponsored threat actors target certain institutions and companies and how to thwart those threats.

Focusing on strategic management in a multicultural, technological and collaborative environment, our **leadership in justice** certificate combines a core administration of justice focus with electives in the management and holistic leadership fields.

Certificates may be completed entirely online. Courses are also offered at our Newport campus, The Center for Adult Education in Warwick, R.I. and in a hybrid classroom/online format.

The Certificate of Graduate Studies

(CGS) is designed for those students who wish to pursue graduate study but may not be interested in obtaining a master's degree. It may be earned by students with baccalaureate degrees or master's degrees from accredited institutions in areas related to the field of study. Students are required to successfully complete all courses with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher to earn the certificate. Should a student desire to continue beyond the certificate by entering the master's program, he or she should contact the Office of Graduate Admissions. If the student is accepted, the required courses already completed may be applied to the master's degree consistent with University policy.

To apply to this program, students must submit the following materials to the Office of Graduate Admissions:

- Completed application
- Official transcripts from each college or university attended
- Two letters of recommendation
- Resume
- Personal Statement

Courses are offered on campus in Newport, R.I., Warwick, R.I. and online.
