Graduate Certificates in Holistic Programs

The Certificate of Graduate Studies

(CGS) is designed for those students who wish to pursue graduate study and may not be interested in obtaining a master's degree. It may be earned by students with baccalaureate degrees or master's degrees from accredited institutions. Students are required to successfully complete all courses with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher to earn the certificate. Should a student desire to continue beyond the certificate by entering the master's program, he or she should contact the Office of Graduate Admissions. If the student is accepted, the required courses already completed may be applied to the master's degree consistent with University policy.

The Certificate of Advanced Graduate Studies (CAGS)

is designed for those students who have completed a master's degree from an accredited institution and who are seeking advanced knowledge within their field of study. Students must consult with the graduate program director before pursuing this certificate regarding the appropriate program for their career interests.

To apply to this program, students must submit the following supporting materials to the Office of Graduate Admissions:

- Completed application
- Official transcripts from each college or university attended
- Two professional letters of recommendation
- Personal statement
- Resume
