

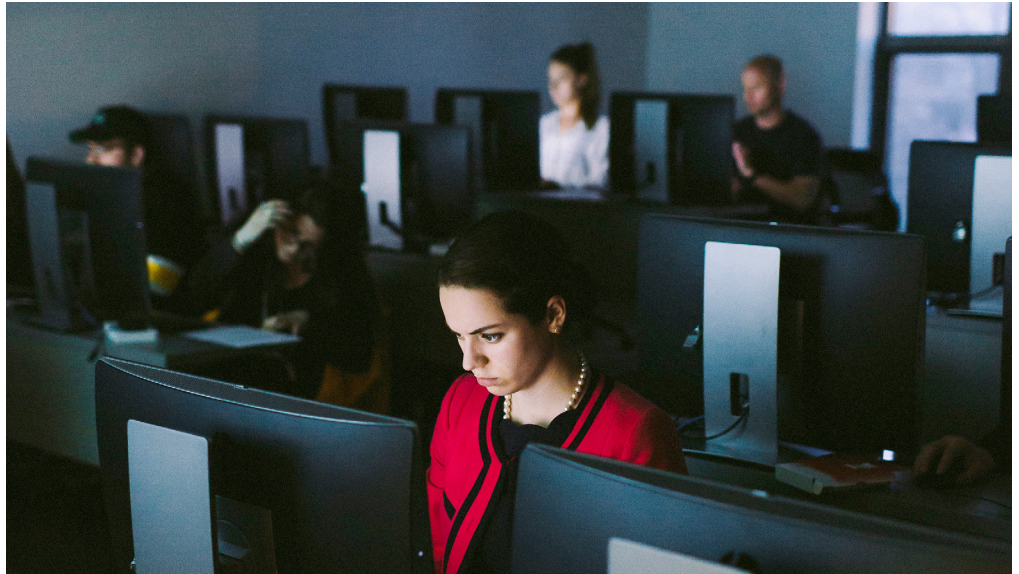


M.S. Administration of Justice and Homeland Security

About the Program

The administration of justice and homeland security programs endeavor to address the professional requirements of justice leaders and practitioners in an increasingly technological and global environment. The objective of the graduate program is to develop professionals who are morally imbued individuals and will serve their communities guided by the principles of equal respect.

The courses and these programs will focus on:

- The philosophical, historical, ethical, behavioral, technological, legal, and policy dimensions of the discipline;
- An analytical approach to practice within the criminal justice system;
- Practical tools to improve effectiveness within the various professional roles;
- The most current and relevant information in a structure that is dynamic and adaptable to rapidly evolving trends.

Students may choose between three concentrations: Leadership in Justice, Digital Forensics or Cybersecurity and Intelligence.

Core Curriculum

To earn the master’s degree in administration of justice and homeland security, students take a minimum of 12 courses (36 credits). This includes 8 required courses and 4 electives.

Admissions Requirements

Individuals with a bachelor's degree in any undergraduate major from a regionally or nationally accredited college or university (or an equivalent degree from an accredited institution outside of the United States) are qualified to apply.

To apply to this program, students must submit the following materials to the Office of Graduate Admissions:

- Completed graduate application
- Official transcripts from each college/university attended
- Personal statement
- Two professional letters of recommendation
- Resume
