Program in Rehabilitation Counseling

The Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification (CRCC) is the national credentialing body for rehabilitation counselors. Upon completion of the program and two years post clinical supervision, students are Certified Rehabilitation Counselors and licensed mental health counselors.

Salve Regina University's program has been accredited for 10 years. The last accreditation was an eight year accreditation earned in 2009. Current program offerings include:

- 48 credit Master of Arts degree in Rehabilitation Counseling
- The 60 credit Master of Arts program in Clinical Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling was created to meet the national demand/trend for a 60 credit master's degree for rehabilitation counselors with mental health licensure.

Students and graduates are not required to take the CRC examination. From January 2017 to August 2020, 23 students became licensed as a Mental Health Counselor in the state of RI after successfully passing the national exam and completing their post-graduate 2,000 hours of clinical supervision.

This program is accredited and meets all the CACREP requirements and the requirements for licensure in R.I., Mass. and Conn.

Graduates of the program are eligible to sit for two national exams: The national Certified Rehabilitation Counselor examination through the CRCC, which establishes their professional expertise in rehabilitation counseling. And, the National Certification Counselor through the NBCC to become licensed as a mental health counselor. Students are expected to take the CRC exam upon graduation or during their final year in the program. Students are also expected to take the NBCC qualifying exam as soon as they are eligible to apply upon completion of the M.A. degree.
